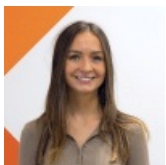

How do you feel empowered as a woman in tech/a workplace?

My gender has nothing to do with my passion for technology, my drive to be successful or my abilities. I feel empowered because I have a clear vision of my future and I know I am on the right path.

My future is in my hands, and I know that if I work hard, it will pay off - I don't give up on my dreams/goals even if I fail first time.

I don't mind if I don't fit the mould, I'm more concerned about authenticity; I want to show myself, my team, and our clients the real me and what I have to offer.

Empowering yourself is one thing, but that is not enough on its own; working at a company like Waterstons that empowers their people, allows you to reach your full potential and feel truly valued is true empowerment.

What have you learned from the women you have worked with in your career so far?

The most empathetic people I have met have all been women.
